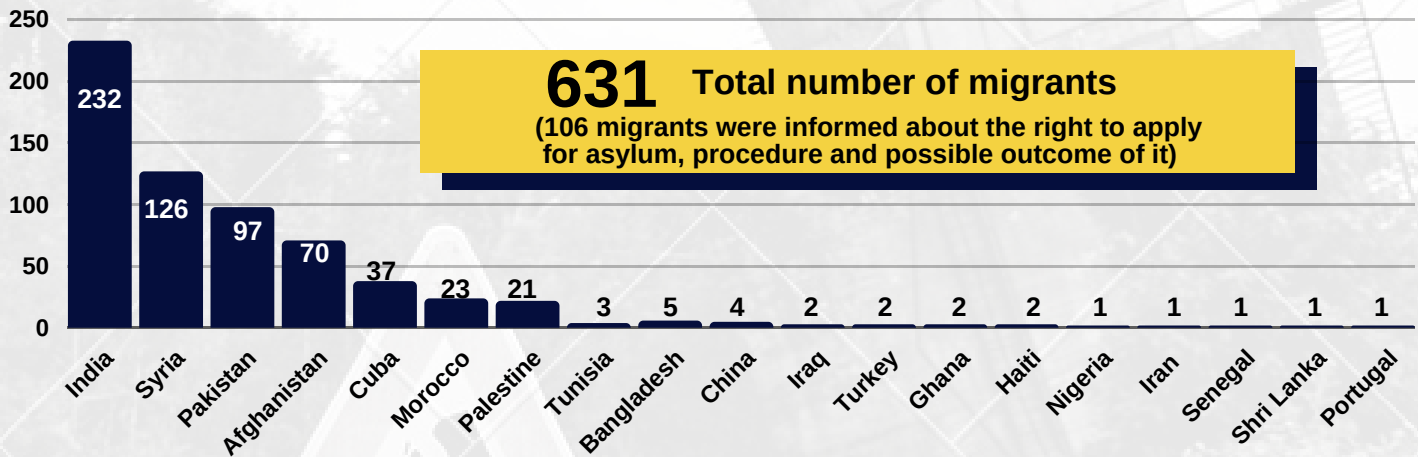

### TOTAL NUMBER AND COUNTRY OF ORIGIN OF MIGRANTS REGISTERED IN TTC TABANOVCE

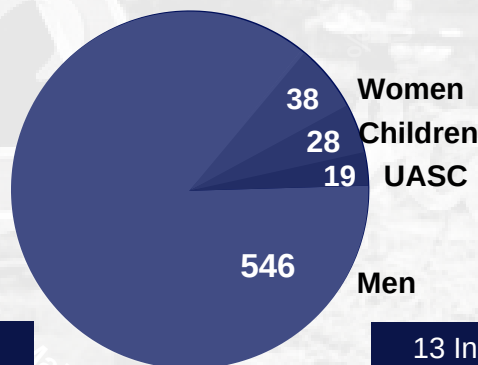


### AGE/GENDER BREAKDOWN

### Summary

**(0 Registered asylum seekers during reporting period)**

During the reporting period in TTC Tabanovce, there is a decreased number of registered migrants and UASC's compared to Third Quarter of 2021.

During the reporting period, migrants from India and Cuba who have entered irregularly in RNM, who were apprehended within the territory of the RNM or detained in TTC VINOJUG, were afterwards transported and left to TTC Tabanovce.

The accommodated migrants are only a small fraction of the total number of the migrants who were apprehended in an attempt to cross state territory irregularly.

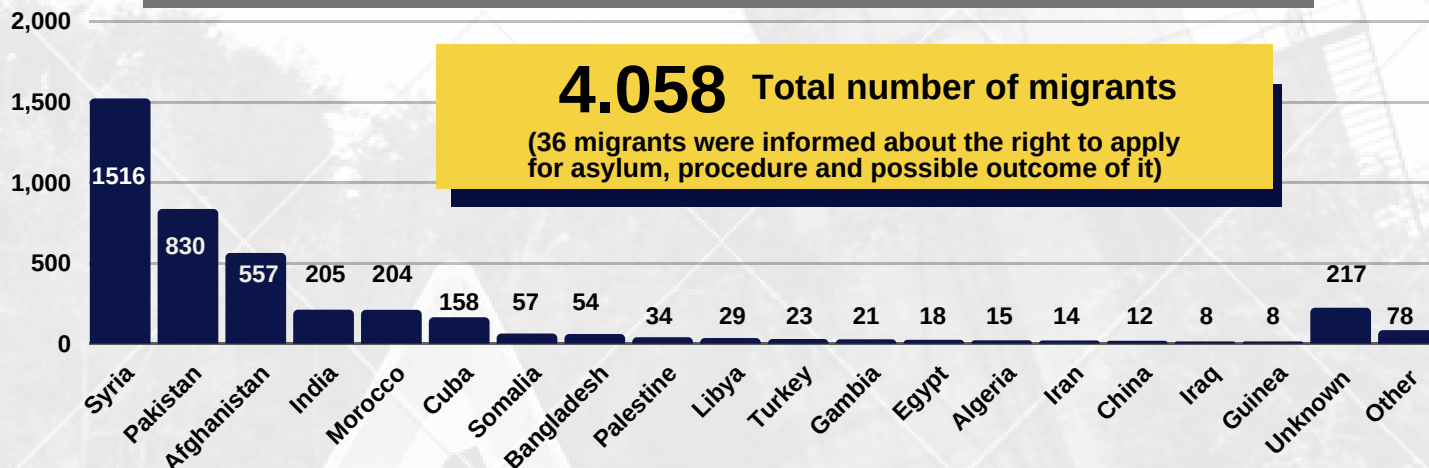

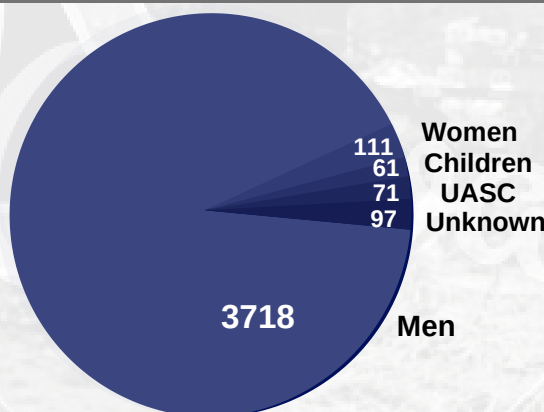

In TTC Vinojug there are 187 migrants who were detained as witnesses in criminal procedures against the smugglers.

### Summary

During the reported period migrants from India and Cuba who have entered irregularly in RNM, who were apprehended within the territory of the RNM and issued a decisions for expulsion, were afterwards transported and left in TTC Tabanovce.

The border police continued with the practice of bringing migrants apprehended in smuggling incidents in order to be witnesses in criminal proceedings in the TTC Vinojug and the rest of the apprehended migrants were returned/pushed back to Greece. This center continued to serve as a place for quarantine accommodation without any legal basis for the apprehended migrants. However, the authorities stopped the practice of bringing asylum seekers to TTC Vinojug in order to be accommodated in quarantine prior to their transfer in the RC for asylum seekers.

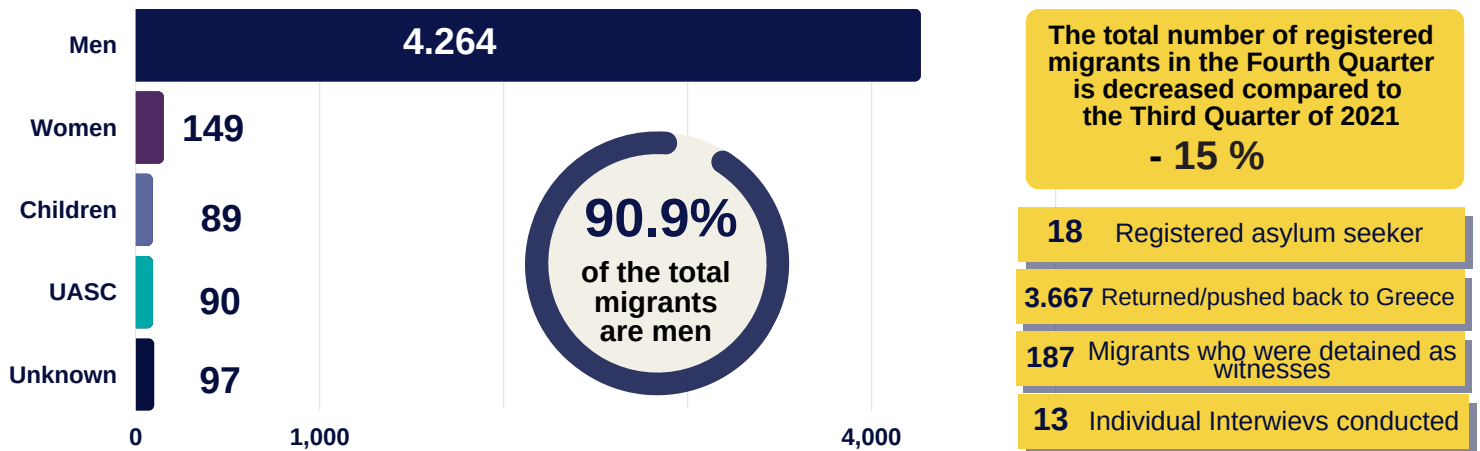

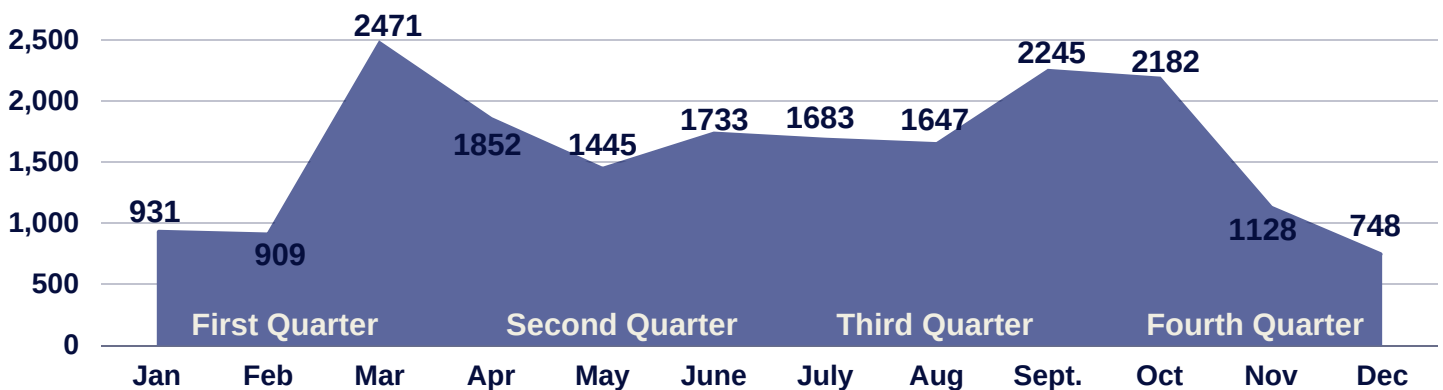

### Specifics:

In the reporting period, 18 asylum seekers have submitted their asylum request. All of them submitted the request in TTC Vinojug.

There is increased number of migrants detained as witnesses in criminal proceedings. During the reported period migrants from India and Cuba who have entered irregularly in RNM, who were apprehended within the territory of the RNM and issued a decision for expulsion, were afterwards transported and left in TTC Tabanovce.

The accommodated migrants are only a small fraction of the total number of the migrants who were apprehended in an attempt to cross state territory irregularly. The border police continued with the practice of bringing migrants apprehended in smuggling incidents in order to be witnesses in criminal proceedings in the TTC Vinojug and the rest of the apprehended migrants were returned/pushed back to Greece. This center continued to serve as a place for quarantine accommodation without any legal basis for the apprehended migrants.
